The fundraiser involved pupils at Clarendon sponsoring Mrs Hill for her climb and all funds will be donated to CHOC East London.



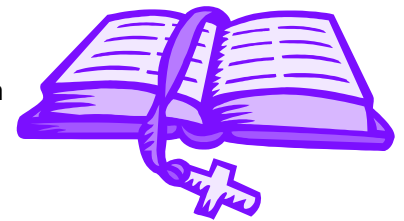
